Exelon actively participates in the political process to promote sound energy, economic and environmental policies that address needs of our customers, communities, and other stakeholders and create value for our investors and is committed to providing transparent disclosure about those activities.

This report includes a listing of the following contributions made during the Reporting Period (July 2022 to December 2022):

- political contributions, including to entities organized under 26 U.S.C. §527, made by Exelon and its subsidiaries for the noted reporting period in compliance with Exelon's Corporate Political Contributions Policy (available on Exelon's website),
- contributions to entities organized under 26 U.S.C. §501(c)(4) and §501(c)(6) regardless of whether such entity's primary focus is political activities,
- membership fees or dues over \$10,000 paid to trade associations and similar §501(c)(6) organizations,
- all membership fees or dues paid to trade associations and similar §501(c)(6) organizations if Exelon or any subsidiary
  or organization owned or controlled by Exelon has an employee who serves on the board of the trade organization,

- non-profit organization receiving matching gifts over \$5,000 made by senior executives.

Exelon may not always agree with the political positions taken by trade associations or chambers of commerce to which we contribute; however, we believe our contributions to these organizations provide an overall benefit to the company. This report is reviewed by the Corporate Governance Committee of the Exelon Board of Directors semi-annually.

Contributions attributed to Exelon Corporation may also include contributions from Exelon Business Services Company, LLC.

Contributions attributed to Pepco Holdings, LLC (PHI) may include contribution by Atlantic City Electric Company (ACE), Delmarva Power & Light Company (DPL), and Potomac Electric Power Company (Pepco).

<u>Note</u>: Exelon and its subsidiaries have several bipartisan PACs that are funded solely through voluntary employee contributions. Exelon provides limited administrative support to each PAC which offer eligible employees a direct means to voluntarily participate in shaping public policy and expressing views on issues related to our business. The disclosures in this report do **not** include contributions made by any of Exelon's PACs.
